Game Damage Statutes and Regulations

Colorado Revised Statute (C.R.S.): 33-3-102 "The State of Colorado is liable for certain damages caused by wildlife..."

Colorado Parks and Wildlife Commission Regulation: Chapter 17





Game Damage Statutes and Regulations

In order to submit a game damage claim a landowner **must** do the following:

- Have legitimate damage to an agricultural product caused by big game
- Reasonably allow hunting access on the property where the damage occurred
- Not charge more that \$499.99 per hunter, per season
- Notify CPW within 10 days of the discovery of the damage
- Complete Proof of Loss forms and turn them into CPW staff within 90 days of the end of damage





Game Damage-Harvested Crops

Usually caused by ungulates

Formulas used depending on damage





Game Damage-Growing Crops

Both ungulates and bears

Formulas used to determine percentage of crop lost





Game Damage-Orchards

Ungulates and bears

Damage type determines the damage claim






Game Damage-Mitigation

Permanent mitigation options

- Permanent stackyards
- Permanent exclusionary fencing
- Electric fencing for apiaries







Game Damage-Mitigation

Temporary mitigation options

- Pyrotechnics
- Rubber buckshot
- Damage panels
- CPW staff intervention
- Take permits vs. Damage hunts

Agricultural infrastructure


Non-eligible species

Wildlife interaction with human environment


- Trash

Importance of Landowner Relationships





Importance of Relationships

Majority of wildlife winter range is on private agricultural land

- Inevitably there will be conflict, it is better to have an argument with someone you know rather than a stranger you are just meeting
- Honest and clearly communicated assessments are critical
- Relationships allow you to be proactive rather than reactive



Importance of Relationships

Human development needs to take wildlife into mind

- Urbanization of historic winter range
- Human footprint on the landscape (ex. trails)
- Large continuous tracks of land are needed to facilitate wildlife movement
 - Fragmentation is an increasing issue faced by wildlife managers today
